# History of St. Michael Parish

A small but dynamic group of local Serbs met at the Greek Orthodox Church in Saratoga on August 27, 1960 and founded Holy Archangel Michael Serbian Orthodox Church with the help of the Kolo Srpskih Sestara (Circle of Serbian Sisters).

The fledgling church's first president was Obrad Kosich. In June of 1961, the Mijo Miljevich family donated 3 ½ acres in Saratoga on which to build a church. In addition to a church, the parishioners' plan included a social hall, Sunday School building, children's play area, parish home, and ample parking. The Kolo began Sunday School classes with 26 children and were conducted at St. Nicholas Russian Orthodox Church in Saratoga.

Following Diocesan approval of the newly organized church, the "opstina" celebrated its first Krsna Slava on November 26, 1961 in a local Episcopal church. Services were performed by Reverend Fathers Svetozar Djuranovic and Borivoj Pavlovic of the San Francisco and Oakland parishes, respectively.

Thereafter, work immediately began to hire an architect to build the social hall, which would temporarily serve as a place of worship and for social gathering. The groundbreaking took place in May of 1962 and dedication of the hall followed in April of 1963. It was blessed by His Grace The Right Reverend Bishop Dionisije. The parish's first assigned priest was the Very Rev. D.J. Shoukletovich, Dean Emeritus of St. Sava Cathedral of New York City.

In November of 1968, under the leadership of Rev. Stoilo Ilich (1967-1976), the Sunday school building as well as the parish home were dedicated. The home was built through the efforts of a small, but dedicated group of parishioners. The Trifco Ivancovich family donated the Sunday

school building which had a capacity for three classrooms, but has since served as the parish chapel pending completion of a future church.

In May of 1963, an unfortunate decision caused a division of the Serbian Orthodox Church in the diaspora. The St. Archangel Michael parish was divided, with many parishioners leaving to establish a new church in Cupertino. The schism endured until 2000 when, by the Grace of God, unity was restored between the parishes. The membership of St. Sava Church in Cupertino sold the property. Proceeds of the sale, together with the building fund of St. Archangel Michael Church, created the means to build a larger church on the Allendale Avenue property.

In June of 2001 a building committee was formed to organize the process. As of August 2023, church construction is still in progress, but is nearing completion with us holding Sunday Services there. In March 2000 the parish welcomed Very Rev. Protopresbyter Slobodan Jovic, his Protinica Djurdja and son Predrag. His last service, preretirement, was on May 23, 2021. He was succeeded by Very Rev. Protopresbyter Vidoslav Vujasin with his wife Protinica Carolina. Fr. Vidoslav held his first service with the parish on June 6, 2021.

#### Sunday School Slava

The Sunday School Slava is dedicated to St. Sava, the first Archbishop of Serbia, the founder of the Serbian Orthodox Church, and who is viewed as the protector of children. The actual date of this Slava is January 27.

#### Kolo Slava

The Women's Auxiliary of St. Archangel Michael Church are also known as our Kolo (or 'Circle' in Serbian). They celebrate the Nativity of the Most Holy Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary as their patron saint. The actual date of this Slava is September 21.

#### **Church Slava**

Our church is dedicated to Saint Archangel Michael. The actual date of this Slava is November 21. On the Sunday closest to this day, the clergy and parishioners of the Serbian Orthodox parishes within the Bay Area come and join us in celebration of our patron saint.

# Education

#### **Children's Education**

As an official auxiliary of the Church, the School shall work in accordance with the religious doctrine of the Orthodox church, all church-sponsored affairs, and the bylaws of the Church. #### **Adult Education**

The gospel teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Church fathers are timeless, and they maintain their importance throughout history. It is our goal to fulfill the mission and task that our Lord gave to his disciples, "Go (therefore) and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all the things that I have commanded you." (MT28,19).

The adult education ministry of our parish strives to fulfill that commandment. Besides the Divine Liturgy, the Gospel readings, and sermons, we occasionally organize lectures, book presentations, religion classes for adults, and cultural events with the purpose of educating adults to better understand the basics and principles of our faith. These programs are open to all existing parishioners, those who are newly baptized and converted adults in our community, as well as any other adult who wishes to learn more about our faith and the teachings of our Lord, Jesus Christ. # **Church Service Support**

#### Altar Boys

Altar boys play an important role in the church by assisting the parish priest during services. They carry the cross, candles or liturgical fans in processions and entrances, maintain the censer, ensuring it has enough live charcoal, loading it with incense and handing it to the parish priest when required. They also prepare the hot water in time for it to be added to the chalice at the Divine Liturgy, prepare the Holy Bread (Nafora) for people to receive after Holy Communion and at the end of the services. They may also be responsible for reading from the Epistle. Altar boys wear an Altar robe, which is blessed by the parish priest prior to placing it on. While there is no age requirement to become an Altar boy, it is recommended that the boy understand the importance of this position before taking on these responsibilities.

#### Tutor

Our church tutors are the first individuals whom visitors and parishioners meet as they enter our church. They play an important role in welcoming all who come to the church, whether to learn more about our Orthodox faith or come to participate in the liturgical services.

In addition to welcoming people to the church, the tutor is also responsible for selling the candles, passing the church plate, collecting offerings from the church congregation, recording the collections and delivering them to the appropriate church elder for deposit at the end of each service. #### Humanitarian

Matthew 25:35-36, 40

For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you welcomed me; I was naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you visited me; I was in prison and you came to me... as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.

The church's humanitarian ministry is based on teachings from the Bible, where charity and assistance to the poor and those in need are well established in the Old Testament. As Jesus taught much about the subject of charity, our permanent humanitarian effort is there to help the underprivileged and people with disabilities, no matter friends or foes. Our efforts are both in our local communities in the US and worldwide, mainly in the area of the Balkan peninsula. We also strongly support the International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) and their efforts throughout the Orthodox Christian world.

Four KOLO's is the humanitarian effort of the Bay Area Serbian Orthodox churches to support children and families, primarily in Bosnia & Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Kosovo & Metohija with the basic essential needs to survive. Our parish partners with the IOCC effort in providing children with school essentials, along with the community rebuilding program called "Roof Over." We also provide support for 'First Harvest Food Bank' in feeding the poor of the Bay Area. In addition, support is provided for various shelters in the Bay Area.
